As James Monroe, the last of the Virginia dynasty, complete his second term; four candidates towered above the others: John Quincy Adams of Massachusetts, Henry Clay of Kentucky, William H. Crawford of Georgia, and Andrew Jackson of Tennessee. All four rivals professed to be "Republicans" but well-organized parties had not yet emerged and John C.
